Dear all,

Firstly, a big welcome to Luther 3! It's going to be a fabulous series and I'm really looking forward to working with you all.

This is just a short note to let you know that we're going to try to 'green' our production as much as possible in the following ways.

- We'll be measuring our carbon footprint for the whole production, using Albert, a carbon calculator specifically designed for TV production. More info here: <http://www.bafta.org/about/sustainability/albert/>
- You'll have noticed we're already issuing double sided scripts and amendments.
- We've eliminated burning DVDs and using couriers for transporting casting tapes, rushes and edits – instead we're uploading to sites such as vimeo.
- We're also trying to eliminate any disposable food and drink containers on set that can't be recycled. To that end, instead of having individual plastic water bottles available, we're providing everyone with an aluminium water bottle and there will be water boxes (like wine boxes but with water, alas) available on set.
- I've asked Clarksons to provide china plates and bowls and metal cutlery rather than using plastic items. If you'd prefer your food to be portable, they have sourced paper, and therefore recyclable, food boxes. I'm still on the lookout for mugs that can be collected at the end of the day and washed up (all suggestions welcome) but, in the meantime, the cups they provide will also be paper and recyclable rather than polystyrene. There will be recycling bins on set at all times.
- If you can car-share, please do. Also, with so many of our locations centrally based, do consider using public transport rather than your own cars. The nearest tube stop or station is always on the movement order and certainly for some of our 10.00am starts, it may well be the fastest way to set.

- Finally, if you're interested, the BBC have licensed a free app you can download – so far only for blackberries and android phones I'm afraid – which measures your journey and gives you a carbon footprint to it. There's a caveat, which is that the data, **not** your actual location and routes, also goes to the BBC. It's for very genuine and green data collection reasons – not because we're spies...

If you have any other ideas for reducing our carbon footprint do please let me know as I'd be really interested to hear them.
